

This map was compiled via memo between FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover and recently appointed Attorney General for President Truman, John Clark. It is a summary report of FBI Field Offices apprehension of 'enemy aliens' the count does not include those persons apprehended or detained by any other law enforcement agency such as the Immigration and Naturalization Service. Moreover, this report is limited in time from December 7, 1941, through June 30, 1945. It also counts those merchant mariners detained separately from their respective field office counts, so although for example the FBI may have apprehended an individual in New York after the declaration of war because he was serving aboard an Italian Merchantman, he was not counted in the total apprehensions for the field office, but rather on a separate tally for those seamen apprehended.

Finally, this is by necessity an undercount of all enemy aliens apprehended by the US government as it does not count the much more numerous arrests by the INS. It is also likely an undercount as this is a summary document for an incoming Attorney General and not a thorough historical counting of all enemy aliens detained by the FBI.

In creating this map NJAHS chose to consolidate field office by states. The FBI does not have field offices in every state and some states have more than one field office. The density of field offices matches roughly the density of people, and while New York state had four field offices, Idaho had none, and a person arrested by the FBI in Boise, Idaho would have been tallied in the Salt Lake field office's count and if he had been in Moscow, Idaho he might have been arrested by either the Salt Lake field office or the Seattle field office.

SUBJECT: FINGERPRINTING REPATRIATES

DATE: April 28, 1945

Reference is made to letter to the Bureau, dated February 3, 1945, in which I advised that Immigration & Naturalization Service was preparing a list of all persons in civilian alien enemy camps, as of December 31, 1944.

Mr. W. F. KELLY, Assistant Commissioner for Alien Control, Immigration and Naturalization Service, has furnished this list and made a request that the Bureau determine whether it has a record on all of the internees. If it is found that the Bureau does not have a record on all of them, Immigration and Naturalization will provide a photograph and fingerprints of such persons.

The list is attached and is made up by camps. It reflects the name, date and place of birth, alien registration number, with name and address of next of kin.

Reference is made to the Memorandum of May 10, 1945, submitted to this Bureau by Mr. C. E. Hatts of your office setting forth the proposed plans in the handling of German Aliens. In your memorandum you requested any comments which I may have concerning this program.

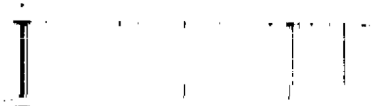
